## Greetings Chapter Presidents,

Now that the holiday celebrations are over and 2019 is in full swing, we have a few reminders for you to share with chapter members.

- Members who submitted workshop and/or takeaway proposals for any of the international conferences will receive an email from Trish Woodley no later than February 15 to confirm the presentation(s). Anyone who has submitted a proposal and has not received a confirmation email by this date should contact the regional director for the corresponding conference.
- Remember to include your local contact information (name, email, and phone number at the very least) anytime you make contact with members or perspective members. This includes any items left on a table or at the school. Often, people will pick up the materials but do not know how to contact anyone about their interest in the Society.
- If you aren't checking the Society website regularly, delegate this task to a chapter web surfer. She can locate resources, note deadlines, discover new information, and share much more with the chapter.
- Don't forget to have enough membership supplies for your next induction. Order new member information kits and certificates, as well as other items for your chapter's needs in the DKG Store. Visit the website and choose the **DKG Store** button in the middle of the home screen.
- Review chapter participation and evaluate activities. Which activities had the greatest attendance? Consider polling your members with some different activities listed and obtain their feedback as to which activities they would attend.
- International conference registrations are now open for all five conferences. Urge your members to register and attend the international conferences. Remind them that they can attend any (and all) of the international conferences.

Beginning January 1, 2019, any new member shall pay half of the 2018/2019 regular dues for the remainder of this fiscal year (July 1, 2018—June 30, 2019). - ◆ Encourage members to apply for Cornet Individual Professional Development Awards by May 1.

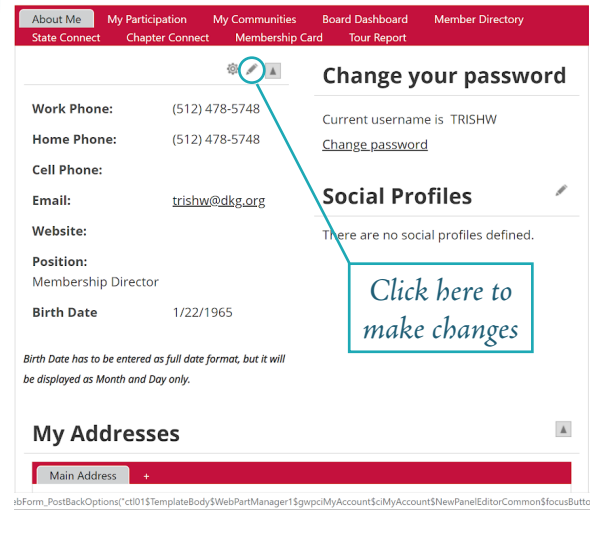
# President to President

What innovative ideas will our newly installed 2019-2021 state organization (SO) presidents bring back to local chapters following the 2019 international conferences? This summer all SO presidents have the opportunity to train with others beyond their region – learning with and from women from throughout the Society who are undertaking the responsibility of leading members in their locale. In the past, unless scheduling conflicts occurred, newly elected DKG officers most often trained exclusively in the regions where they served. While this setup was convenient on the surface, it was limiting in the scope of opportunities to share and learn from leaders across the Society. Realizing this, attendees at the 2018 DKG Convention elected to broaden the concept of international's training for incoming state officers. The summer 2019 conferences will expose those being trained to new ideas, to different ways to address issues faced by many SO's, and to lasting relationships with colleagues across the Society, not just within their region. It's an opportunity to look beyond set boundaries toward the true global aspect of DKG. Chapters will ultimately be the beneficiaries of this summer's training when information is shared through state organization communications and at fall meetings. The best practices in one region will now become the innovations in multiple regions. It's a win-win for all!
