I would like to thank the committee chairs and members who agreed to continue to lead our organization forward during the next two years and to the chapter presidents who are entering into their second year of their biennium. For my biennium theme...I'm challenging all of us to "reimagine our future and reignite our purpose" for doing what we do best...empowering women educators and inspiring leadership! I hope you took one of the little cards I had in the basket up front and read its message. "Before you're a leader, success is all about growing yourself. Returning to my biennium theme... Our Keynote Speaker for convention 2024, Dr. Denise Furlong, said to me this summer in Phoenix...," How come I never heard of you!"

Ladies...she is a professor at Georgian Court! WE CAN increase our membership. It's up to all of us to look around and invite women to join us. There's no doubt that we have a marketing issue. We're working on that! Others need to know who we are. Get the brand out there, we have the DKG magnetic tags, to place on the back of your car. Simple things like this start the conversations we need to have. Let's begin by advertising ourselves – starting today.

For my President's Project this biennium, I'd like to continue the work we started with Booksmiles and support children's literacy. Our goal is to collect 15,000 books for children. We can make a huge impact on the lives of children. When action meets compassion, lives change. These actions also give us the opportunity to showcase DKGNJ. Booksmiles has grown even larger and is making a broader impact on children's and teachers' lives. Please check out their website, I know you'll be impressed and supportive of this initiative.

MEMBERSHIP

Twelve Chapters were represented in our meeting. Attendees were introduced to our Logic Model initiative for the biennium, which is "to involve our current membership to recruit new members, concentrating on active educators." Lower membership data and causes were cited as well as actions for potential, active, collegiate and chapters officers to address. A presence at next year's NJEA conference is included in the plan.

- Chapters were urged to make sure their rules and bylaws allow collegiate members.
- A brochure from the International Membership and Expansion Committee was distributed to clarify who is eligible for membership.
- A script to phone call former members was also given out, as research had shown that 59% of dropped members would likely return to the organization.
- Other handouts were shown and passed around. Many attendees requested the documents be also emailed to them as electronic files, including the month-to-month guide for membership chairs.
- Slips with the county teachers of the year were also distributed to the chapters which encompassed the area where the person is instructing, in hopes that they could be contacted and encouraged to become a part of DKG.

We will keep in contact with ideas and results of reaching out to others. Darci Erickson has offered to help with the prepared script to help recruit new members as stated in the logic model that President Irene Maskaly, 1st Vice President Cathy Fortunato and I worked on during our June training in Texas with DKG International.

HISTORIAN

PJ Madreperl presented the Historians report.

The committee made up of Chapter representatives for the Historian Committee continue with their ongoing history of their Chapter. In the past year, all Chapters were consulted to determine if they had materials/records that were of a certain age that they would like to archive in the State Archives at Georgian Court. The Chapters that responded determined they wanted to maintain all records within the Chapter.

The Historian Committee will turn its focus this year to State records through the different officers and committees. Future Action(s)

In the coming year, the Historian Committee will:

- Visit Georgian Court and assess the facilities for practical storage space.
- Work with State officers and Chairs to determine what records and materials they possess.
- Determine a date where prior records may be archived at Georgian Court to lessen the burden of storing records at one's home or other facility.
- Assess the appropriate storage supplies needed to house the records to ensure the safety of the records from any outside elements.
- Work to support new and continuing Chapter Historians.

NECROLOGY

Darci Erickson (Eta) presented her report.

- We covered how to use the google forms to complete Form 6 and update necrology chair info and how to access the forms.
- We discussed and brainstormed ideas for keeping member bios current and for connecting with less active members.

COMMUNICATIONS

- The Communications Committee Report from the 2023 Convention was reviewed and recommendations from that report were discussed with the committee.
